

Global citizenship and leadership programme

This is an 18 month programme for sixth form students which has been designed in response to the government and education agenda around improving global learning and community cohesion.

The programme aims to facilitate schools in embedding an ethos that develops passionate, responsible, socio-cultural and globally aware students, enabling them to flourish in an increasingly global marketplace.

The core elements of the programme are as follows:
